A Message from the Bishop Elect

In the short season of Advent we live in the expectation of God's greatest gift to us in the Son, the Christ, the Incarnation of God's all-encompassing love. Making Advent's waiting and reflecting a priority can be challenging, with the allure of family reunions, the holiday break from work and school, and the markdowns at malls and online stores. Even in our church settings, we struggle to balance our Advent experience with planning for the festive celebrations of Christmas and Epiphany. You have shown yourselves to be an immensely welcoming and caring community to Lisa and myself, and we are deeply thankful for the many ways you have reached out to us. It was great meeting many of you during our week in the diocese earlier this month, and we look forward with great hope and joy to Epiphany when our journey together begins in earnest.

We have wonderful news to share. God is in love with us, each and every one of us, and nothing can separate us from the love of God in Christ. By water and the Holy Spirit we have been made members of Christ's own Body. May the Peace of Christ be with you as we enter into a new year in God's mission field.
