This time in the church year begins with the fasting and self-examination of Lent, it revolves around the awesome mystery of the Lord's death and resurrection and it leads us through the feasting of Easter to the celebration of the gift of the Holy Spirit. It is easy to think of this liturgical cycle in literal terms, as though our church observances are a kind of recreation of historical events we gather to remember. But the whole mystery of the death, resurrection, ascension of Christ and the coming of the Spirit is one reality by which God has begun to remake all creation. 
Brent House events at the University of Chicago
